Partnership defense is perhaps the hardest part of bridge. Here is a hand from a major pairs championship where one wrong card played would result in changing a top to a near bottom. The bidding is shown at left.

West's first pass denied three spades (a double would show three and a raise four). The rest of the auction was a typical match point auction.

How would you and your partner handle the defense? The first three tricks were three spades with West pitching the club 10. This promised a high honor in clubs. Seeing the queen in dummy, East could confidently play the club 3 to West's Ace. The club 3 also promised a high honor. Now the spotlight turned to West. Down two was almost a certainty, but would his double compensate for a missed game in spades? Looking at dummy, the only chance for another trick was the spade queen. The problem was to force partner to play another spade rather than a diamond. The answer was simple. West cashed the diamond ace before returning a club to East's king. East could now see that the only chance for another trick was to play another spade. On the return of a spade, South was helpless. Quite a few E-W's were scoring +420 in a spade game,so +500 was essential for a top score.

A Brief History of Duplicate Bridge in Spokane By Kay Fergie

The beginning of duplicate bridge in Spokane was in the late forties under the directorship of George Welch. I played my first duplicate game with my mother in 1950. The games were held in the cocktail lounge of the old Spokane Hotel which was on the property now occupied by the Ridpath Motor Inn. The games were later held in other rooms of the hotel, including the mezzanine which overlooked the dining room and the Blue Room (the entry fee was 50 cents!!). Madeline Flaherty and Roland Christy became directors and then later Rosemary Wynia and Rhea Welch. Later, games were held at the Spokane House and the Francis Lester Hotel. For a number of years the game results were published weekly in the newspaper. In 1964 I moved to Ephrata, WA-I enjoyed duplicate there and in Wenatchee-I began directing in the area. I did attend most of the tournaments in Spokane so kept in touch with the players. I returned to Spokane in 1983. At that time, Patricia Wright and Dave Westfall managed a playing site on east Trent Avenue. Later, Barbara Blodgett and Dave Westfall managed a playing area on Broadway and Ash. Fern Koenig directed games in her home and in East Spokane. I began directing in 1985. In 1990 I leased a space in a building (the former Rocking Horse Restaurant) on First Avenue and Cowley. In June 1999 we moved to 6th Avenue and were there until December, 2004 when we moved to the Budget Inn (now the Quality Inn). Some of you wonder why we have the McLane Trophy Race at the unit games. Henry McLane was a very faithful club and unit game attendee. He used to take the Greyhound bus to tournaments where he had "pick-up" partners and managed to do very well. When he passed away, his wife Mary wanted to do something in Henry's memory and that is why we have the McLane Trophy Race.
